Objective:

With the UCAH's growth to over 2700 participants, JHTO leadership wishes to learn more about the outstanding research being performed beyond the UCAH funded efforts. JHTO leadership has asked that the Forum technical talks be opened to any UCAH participant. For fairness and transparency, UCAH is publishing this abstract call for funded hypersonic research.

Eligibility:

- You must be an approved UCAH participant to attend and present at this meeting. No foreign
 nationals are permitted to attend. The request to participate can be found on the UCAH website,
 https://hypersonics.tamu.edu/membership/. Your request must be approved prior to the Forum.
- Research must be government or industry funded and must be hypersonics related.
- UCAH funded PIs are not eligible.
- By submitting an abstract, you agree to submit a final presentation by 12 August 2024, attend the meeting (26-28 August), and deliver a 20-minute presentation (17 minutes briefing/3 minutes Q&A)

Abstract Submittal Instructions

Step 1: Access the Abstract Submittal Site through the UCAH webpage, https://hypersonics.tamu.edu/call-for-abstracts/

Step 2: Complete the call for abstracts submission form.

- a. If your abstract is Distribution A, you may use the submission form to upload.
- b. If your abstract is not Distribution A, please email <u>ucah-admin@tamu.edu</u> to have a DOD Safe link sent to you. You must still submit the submission form, but do not upload your abstract.

The anticipated Distribution Statement for your presentation is a required field when submitting an abstract. This helps the program planning committee to place your presentation appropriately in a session's agenda if accepted.

Submit only unclassified abstracts that are distribution statement A or C (regardless of the anticipated presentation distribution statement). Abstracts may be published as a part of the Forum proceedings.

Abstract length is limited to 300 words. Exclude tables or figures. State the objective of the work. Describe the scope, method of approach, and any new advances in the state of the art. Highlight important conclusions and include a brief summary of the data used to substantiate them.

Many organizations require abstracts to be processed through an approval system prior to submission. This process takes additional time. Plan accordingly to meet the abstract deadline date. **Abstract Deadline: 31 May 2024**
